Director's Note:

I came across the incident that constitute the story of this film while doing research for another project. As familiar as I am with the overall events that took place, I was stunned that I didn't know this small, but significant piece of history - a very personal and compelling footnote to one of the most consequential chapters in the chronicle of the 20th Century.

Mark shot David Arrow's previous film Five Questions, which won numerous awards for his cinematography.

Joseph Huba (Editor) is an editor with over a decade of experience in the industry. He loves working on a wide range of projects, from beauty and fashion to branded content, documentaries, and short films. Joseph is known for his keen eye for detail and his ability to tell compelling stories through his editing. His work has been featured in various film festivals and industry events, earning him recognition for his technical expertise and creative vision. With a passion for filmmaking and a commitment to excellence, Joseph is a dedicated professional who is always eager to take on new challenges and push the boundaries of his craft.
